Most* Sundays at Noon In Person or Online



Thanks for Supporting Family Promise MVPC

Recently we received a letter from Family Promise. They have a formula for calculating the monetary value of the volunteer hours and meals that our congregation gave in 2021. The numbers are pretty realistic, I think. They figure \$13.50 per hour for food prep time and overnight hosting, and \$17.00 per meal provided.

We were blown away by the grand total of what we provided – \$36,615.73! Thanks be to God for the resources He gives that allow us to be generous. What a privilege! And thanks to all who have made this happen!

And in other news – the Friendship House team prepared food and served 81 folk this month. The team leaders of Laurel and Paul Coalwell were joined by eight others to help out. This has not been any easy undertaking. Supply issues have forced them to change the menu up to three times before they could find enough provisions for the meal prep some months. Thanks so much for your leadership and giving spirit!



Success Story from Friendship House



Meet Lewis.

Lewis is 31, and has been homeless repeatedly since the age of 18. The last time he was homeless started about a month and a half before he was in our shelter. For the last four years, he was couch surfing, sleeping outside, at drop in centers, and temporarily staying with a friend. When asked what it was all like, Lewis Replied, "Utterly chaotic. I just could not get a leg up. Was okay with it until I had to make a change. At drop in shelters you feel like a street mentality, get in altercations, feel disrespected and many people were using, making it hard to stay sober."

Although he had slept outside multiple times before, he was living on the streets for two weeks straight before getting a bed in the Men's House. "This area is my home and I wanted to make it work here," Lewis told me. He feels like he has a net of support here. He had to make it work in Skagit County. There was a lot needing to change in Lewis's life, and when reflecting he referred to his feelings as "the gift of desperation".

His family knew about the Friendship House, and friends knew about the meals and had brought him to dinner at our café. The first time he tried to make sobriety work he came here but moved out into a friend's house. This current stay was his first time doing the 90 days and he feels it has greatly influenced and changed his life.

Regarding his time with us, Lewis says he appreciated the room to grow, the responsibilities he had received and the progress he made. During his stay, he was able to get a better grasp on his mental health. Finally, he was on stable meds, which would not have happened without Kristie guiding him. His attitude towards life has changed. He can handle stressful situations so much better. Part of this growth was from gaining insight through his experiences at the men's house. As alcohol worked its way out of his life, positive mental health, counseling and hobbies worked their way into his life. All the stuff he used to love doing came back to him. Skating, drawing, writing, photography, Magic: The Gathering.

Something he wishes people knew about being homeless is that you become a product of your environment. If no one cares about you, you don't care about yourself or try to make yourself better or change. It takes a considerable effort to get out of homelessness and that unhealthy hole. To create change in one's life you need stability, guidance, and someone to care and facilitate the effort to change.

Here Lewis received one on one time with the shelter manager, guidance, tips, links to resources, and support. "I'm extremely grateful for the opportunity friendship house has given me to improve my life" Lewis shared.

June 1st Lewis was accepted into an Oxford House, which is a shared sober living space. When he is comfortable in his role at the Oxford House, he is looking to volunteer his time and give back here at the Friendship House. When asked what is next for him, Lewis listed the following: his license, a car, being employable, stability, finding a job, and developing new skills.

We applaud your success, and are eager to see what is next for you!

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR ONE PARISH ONE PRISONER TEAM

The following words of Father Greg Boyle touch us deeply. He is the founder of Homeboy Industries and an Underground Ministries Advisory Board Member.

As the new year gets underway, it is time to update you about our MVPC One Parish One Prisoner (OPOP) team. We currently are in relationships with one man who is now out of prison, and another who remains at the Monroe Correctional Center.

Our brother Leroy was released in October 2021, and is now living in Mount Vernon with his bride Anahi. He is a changed man, when compared to the Leroy we knew during his previous release back in 2018. When we see Leroy now, we note a sense of peace in his demeanor and a sincerity in his actions that was missing in the past. He is meeting every requirement of his Department of Corrections Graduated Re-Entry Program, and at this rate he should be free of all DOC restrictions in September. He is succeeding in his new job at the T. Bailey company in Anacortes. He is reunited with many members of his extended family.

All of this brings joy to our hearts!

Our brother Joe Ray remains incarcerated at Monroe, and now is expecting to be released in August of 2023. The pandemic has made this a very difficult time to be incarcerated. Visits have not been permitted for almost all of his stay, and most educational programs and jobs for inmates have been on hold. He has weathered one bout of covid already, but lives daily under the threat of re-infection, as it is running rampant among the inmates and staff.



Sarah, Joe Ray, Madeline

When we started our journeys with Leroy in 2017 and Joe Ray in 2019, OPOP had not yet reached the level of training efficiency that is firmly in place now. Before we were ready or really knew what to expect, Leroy was released. It did not go well that time, but we have all learned so much since then.

When Joe Ray was paired with our team we were still reeling from the events that surrounded Leroy's 2018 return to prison. In addition, Joe Ray was released at the exact same time that all of the pandemic lockdowns began. It was so disappointing for all of us to not be able to safely spend the 1:1 and group time with him that we had planned. With God's grace, when he is released 18 months from now it will be a totally different experience.

There are now more than 25 churches in the OPOP program. For these churches, the months before inmate release have been a time for team building, and for really learning to understand the stones and layers that can prevent the incarcerated from successfully navigating life outside of the penal system. When an OPOP team has had a year or more for training and relationship building with each other and with the incarcerated partner before release, the likelihood of a good outcome is greatly increased.

We now have the blessing of that amount of time before Joe Ray's expected release. With 18 months to go, this is an ideal time to have more folks join our team. We would love to see the team grow to the ideal 6-8 committed members. With new members, we can start the training from the beginning again, with the benefit of all of the great resources developed by Chris Hoke and his team. We didn't have those the first time around.

As an OPOP team member, you would be expected to:

- Attend the monthly Zoom team meeting, generally 1 to 1.5 hours. In-person meetings may resume when safe to do so.
- Study an assigned online learning module before the meeting about 30-45 minutes.
- Follow the meeting format where we pray, check in with each other, discuss the learning module, and share what we have learned about ourselves and our friend through our relationship.
- Write letters and/or emails to our friend. This is an expected and vital part of the program. It really isn't hard to do, once you get started. We can help newcomers get past any hesitation to write that first letter. After the exchange of a few US Mail letters, a switch to the prison email system is easier. It does not reveal your personal email address.
- Once pandemic protocols allow it, prison visits are also strongly encouraged. It is possible to do those in groups of 2 or 3 team members. Visits are safe, well-supported by facility staff, and enormously appreciated by our friends.
- When release time is drawing near, divide up the tasks of helping our friend to navigate such things as finding housing, transportation, obtaining a driver's license, and getting a job when the time is right. The key here is to HELP as needed, and not to take over doing it for him or her.

We hope this gives you an idea of what we have been doing over the past 4 years of our MVPC OPOP partnership, and how we would love to have your participation as we move into the future.
