Music Fellowship

"Make a joyful noise unto the Lord, all ye lands...come before his presence with singing".

These are the beginning lines of Psalm 100 which is described in the KJV as "an exhortation to praise God cheerfully for his greatness and for his power". Notice, the psalmist does not suggest that you must sing a

beautiful, melodious, on-pitch song unto the Lord. It doesn't even have to be a song. He says, "make a joyful NOISE", asking only that it be done with joy and from the heart. Psalm 150 describes a myriad of options: trumpet, harp, lyre, timbrel, strings, pipe, cymbals. Even dancing!

The prolific hymn writer, John Wesley, echoed similar sentiments in his "rules for singing" found as a preface to the United Methodist Hymnal. "See that you join with the congregation as frequently as you can. Let not a slight degree of weakness or weariness hinder you. If it is a cross to you, take it up and you will find a blessing." "Sing lustily and with good courage. Beware of singing as if you were half dead, or half asleep; but lift up your voice with strength. Be no more afraid of your voice now, nor more ashamed of its being heard, than when you sung the songs of Satan." If you enjoy singing, or playing an instrument, or just clapping your hands, don't worry about what it sounds like to others. Know that the Lord hears and cherishes your praises just the same.

As the program year begins at MVPC, we have many opportunities to express our love and praise through music: a bell choir, a traditional vocal choir and a praise band. And if you have even the smallest inkling of interest, no matter your skill, I would encourage you to seek them out this season. None of those feel quite right? We are open to any ideas you might have for special music and other new ways to praise God through music.

And if none of these options are in your comfort zone, that's fine too. I would simply encourage you to do as Psalm 135 suggests, "Praise the LORD, for the LORD is good; [make music] to his name, for that is good".



I will share your joy and sorrow till we see this journey through.


And then the final verse concludes:

New Earth Recovery

New Earth Recovery loves, strengthens, and accompanies people in recovery from addiction through faith-based healing community.

During 2022

- •37 reported starting or deepening their faith
- •31 restored relationships with family
- •23 found employment or attended college while in residence, while the rest volunteered in the community

- •18 completed the Genesis relapse prevention program
- •10 regained their driver's licenses
- •4 who had unresolved court issues became free from justice system involvement
- •11 found secure housing upon departure

New Earth Recovery has served 240 people since opening their first house in 2011!

Dales Story: A testimony

I was married before and I was clean for 12 years and then I lost my wife to cancer. I went out on the streets using again for eleven years after her death. I was homeless for 5 years of that and then my girlfriend, Chelsea, and I got really sick from the drugs and how we were living. We were put into a hospital in Bellingham for 30 days. We almost died.

After they let us out we were homeless and were trying to get help so we wouldn't go back on the street while living in a motel in Bellingham trying to figure things out. I came back to Mount Vernon to work and ended up doing drugs again and got arrested. I spent some time in jail and started talking to Chelsea. She had got into Faith House, her friend told her about it, and she told me I needed to so some real soul searching.

When I was leaving jail, I told the judge that I wanted to go to treatment and the judge said, "If Mr Henry wants help, we're going to get him help." They sent me to Tukwila for treatment. When I got out of treatment, Randall (director of The Foundation house) picked me

up and took me to The Foundation house. I stayed there and went through the Genesis process, basically just worked on myself. When I finished Genesis, I moved over to The Trust. And then, Chelsea and I were able to get married! We had the wedding at Faith House. That was quite a deal!

We're members of Radius church now for three years. When I tried church out, I knew it was the place for me. Before this, I didn't know the Bible, I didn't know Jesus, I hadn't turned my life over to him. When I lost my wife, I gave up on God, but NER has given me a new outlook. I knew I could talk to Randall or Alan if I had questions about the Bible. I built a good foundation with NER and now I'm carrying it on through my life. I've been clean three and a half years now and it's great! I help with an outreach program though my church, I've got a job with the Sedro Woolley school district, and Chelsea and I moved into our own apartment in January. We try to tell people about NER because they did such a great job. If I can point somebody in that direction and help them to get clean and sober, that's what I do.



A thank you letter arrived from Friendship House thanking MVPC for the \$1000 donation to help with the purchase of a working refrigerator for the Friendship House Café which allows them to continue to feed and shelter those experiencing for food and shelter crisis in the community.

From the website of Love Inc a story that makes use of the programs offered by Love Inc.

"As you know, we are extremely fortunate to own a residential duplex that is used for Transitional Housing. This is not meant to be long-term low-income housing. Rather, it is a program designed to provide housing to struggling local families. This program helps them regain stability and become self-sufficient.

This relational ministry uses the proven resource of our Loving Hope Mentoring Program, while providing clients with housing for 6-12 months, for very little rent. As clients begin to "get on their feet" financially, they are surrounded by Christian volunteers from local churches who help them with mentoring and life skills.

John and Mary came to Love INC after being released from prison. They had nothing!



started with a visit to our "Lets... Dress For Your Success" boutique. She needed clothing for a job interview. She got the job. Soon after, so did John.

This was just the beginning! They moved into our Transitional House and began to really do the work. As required, they attended our Budget Mentoring class and began working with their mentor and implementing what they had learned. They saved money to pay off debt and began saving for a down payment for their own home.

With commitment, determination, and hard work, they achieved their goal and bought their first home! They went from homelessness to homeownership!"

CROP Hunger Walk - Ending Hunger One Step at a Time!

Mount Vernon Presbyterian along with others in the community in walking in the Skagit CROP Hunger Walk this year! The walk will be on Sunday Sept 24 and will start at 2:00pm at Mount Vernon Christian School on Blackburn Street. The walk is 3.4 miles (with a 1 mile family-friendly route available.)

The significance of the 3.4 mile distance is that is how far (mostly) women and girls throughout many thirdworld countries have to walk every day to get water for their family needs. Dogs on leashes and strollers are welcome. Money raised from this event will go towards ending hunger locally and globally. Small hygiene items will be collected for walkers to drop off at the Friendship House during the walk.

Walkers are encouraged to register and donate online at <u>events.crophungerwalk.org/2023</u>.

Also, checks may be made to MVPC and marked for the "Crop Hunger Walk". We are hoping for a great turnout bring the whole family and the dog! Many of us "more senior" will probably only make the 1 mile route, but it will be a fun time of fellowship and for a very good cause.

Family Promise's "Night Without a Bed"

MVPC is excited to host Family Promise's "Night Without a Bed", formerly know as "Homeless for a Night". This year's progam is being called, "DREAM BIG"

The program begins at 6:00 with entertainment from a local bluegrass band, followed by testimonials and a speaker or two. After the program those who wish to, will be spending the night in the cars in solidarity with folks who have no bed to call their own. There will also be space to sleep on the floor if that works better for you. Church will be open for restroom use and there will

be coffee and donuts in the morning.

We would love to see a large turnout from MVPC even if it is only for the program. We understand that for many of us,



our camping out days are in the past.
